Partner Forum Conference – 28th September

The Bradford for Everyone programme is one of five integration areas funded by MHCLG to test what works and what doesn't in integration and. Community Energy Ambassadors training courses

It is difficult to miss everything that is going on with energy prices at the moment. Two energy suppliers went bust last week, four could go this week, some experts suggest there may only be 10 suppliers left by the end of the year and gas prices are rocketing. Many households are going to find it extremely difficult to heat their homes and pay rising energy bills this winter.

If you support vulnerable households, or have links into local communities, then why not train a staff member or volunteer up as a Community Energy Ambassador? These free courses will equip attendees to be able to advise local residents on ways to reduce their energy costs and provide loads of useful information on the schemes available to help people to heat their homes over the winter - all of which can be shared with your clients/beneficiaries/service users etc. They will also tell you exactly what is going on at the moment in terms of energy prices and suppliers and what to do to help people through this difficult period, including if their supplier goes bust.

The courses are funded by Northern Gas Networks so are **free** to anyone in Yorkshire, the Northeast and Cumbria.

The Opportunity Centre

The Opportunity Centre is a social enterprise, which works with people of all ages in the Yorkshire and Humber areas. They provide a number of adult employability services in the Bradford area. They have recently launched their **Positive Moves** programme, in partnership with the Department of Work and Pensions, which provides caring wrap-around support to 16 to 24 year olds in the Bradford area, to help them move positively into learning, training or work. Participants can sign up via a referral from from a Universal Credit Work Coach.

They are a delivery partner for **Bradford Employment Hub**, which is part-funded by the European Social Fund. This is a free programme which helps unemployed people aged 18 and over. The programme lasts up to 6 months, and aims to get people back into work via a Key Worker and a series of workshops which teach valuable skills such as CV writing, job searching and confidence building.

Progress2work supports those further from the labour market using new and tried and tested methods aimed at adults aged 25 and over. Part-funded by the European Social Fund, it aims to help adults get back into work through individual support and non-traditional employability activities such as confidence building, therapeutic techniques, volunteering and CV writing.

They also offer aspire2work, a vocational training programme for young people aged 16-19 (or up to 25 with an EHCP). It offers learners the chance to gain work experience and also receive careers guidance as they learn.

The current High Sheriff of West Yorkshire, Clive Lloyd Esq, is pleased to open the latest round of The High Sheriff of West Yorkshire Fund in partnership with Leeds Community Foundation and with thanks to support from the Mayoral Combined Authority. The Fund welcomes applicants from across West Yorkshire to apply for grants of up to £2,500 to prevent and combat local crime.

The fund invites applications from 1-year projects that are working with young people to create safer communities. Projects should be youth led; this means that the project-idea should come from young people. If projects are adult led, young people aged 5 to 25 years should play a significant role in the management and delivery.

They anticipate that successful applicants will be awarded grants from late November 2021 with the one-year projects beginning after this.

CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

Joined Up

JoinedUp is a new collective leadership programme for youth leaders, social workers and school leaders to learn together, listen to communities together and work together to change the system supporting children and young people. Youth workers, social workers and school leaders are trained in isolation from each other and mostly carry on working in silos throughout their careers. This programme is designed to break down these barriers and contribute to personal development.

JoinedUp leaders will:

- Build strong, cross-sector relationships and work in local clusters to understand the concerns, joys, and hopes of children and young people in their area.
- 2. Visit and be inspired by youth centres, social care settings and schools.
- 3. Develop the *specific* leadership skills required for excellence in their profession and the insights and relationships required to start changing the system in their area.
- 4. Design and trial new ways of working together locally to support children and young people in their care.
- 5. Influence the system by sharing learning with policymakers, funders and senior system leaders.
- 6. Ultimately, create a new system of support for children and young people.

JoinedUp is free for professionals working in the youth sector.

Volunteering Bradford – New Member of Staff

Hello, my name is Rachel Gallagher and I have just joined Volunteering Bradford as a Volunteering Information and Advice Worker for one day a week.

I've worked in the voluntary sector for over 13 years and have set up and managed 3 volunteer-led services. At the moment I also work as a Volunteer Coordinator for a local Town Council. In previous roles I've benefited from the support and advice that Volunteering Bradford give to organisations and voluntary sector staff to make sure that volunteers have the best possible experience. I'm delighted to now have the opportunity to work with and learn further from them.

Volunteers make a significant contribution to organisations and have an extremely positive impact on their communities, and are great people to work with. I'm looking forward to meeting and speaking to people who want to volunteer, and supporting them to find roles that they're going to enjoy and get a lot out of.

Training for volunteers

<u>Skills for Volunteers</u> C3679881. 4 sessions, starting Monday 20th September 10:00 to 12:00. Fee £25.60. (The course may be free if on an income related benefit).

Volunteering: Skills for Volunteers (C3679881). This course provides an introduction to the key skills of communication, assertiveness, time and stress management. It also covers essential knowledge related to policies and procedures including equality, diversity, inclusion, health & safety and safeguarding.

CGL – Change Grow Live

The role of a Change, Grow, Live Independent Visitor is to build a healthy and child focused relationship with a young person who is in the care of the local authority; aiming to support them to grow in confidence, feel valued and thrive in their lives. IVs are usually matched to a young person according to a variety of considerations such as interests and hobbies. The IV will be fully trained for the role and will be supported throughout. The Change, Grow, Live team will make a match with a young person and organise an initial meeting where they can meet their young person, talk about themselves, plan what they would like to do and agree on when they would like to meet. The role has an element of responsibility to report regularly on all meetings and contact as outlined by the project. <u>Find out more</u>

VOLUNTEERING

NEW VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNTIES

<u>Home-Start Bradford District</u> is a voluntary organisation that uses a local community network of trained volunteers and expert support. We help families with children under five with regular practical and confidential support in their own home.

We know that being a parent can be lonely, frustrating and overwhelming. We are there for families when they need it the most, because childhood can't wait.

Home-Start volunteers are parents or have parenting experience and understand that sometimes family life can be tough and that is why their support can be so valuable in helping another family. Volunteers are central to our service and we could not offer families the same support without them. **Skills**

A full role description, including the necessary skill set can be found <u>here</u>. The main skills required:

- Parenting Experience
- Empathy
- A commitment of 2 to 3 hours a week
- A commitment of a year's volunteering
- Be able to offer support, friendship, practical support
- Be able to emphasise the positive aspects of family life
- Be happy to go into the family home
- Encourage the family to meet a wider network of peers and support networks.

Potential volunteers will be invited for an interview before taking part in a Volunteer Preparation Course where they will meet like-minded people and have fun, whilst learning the skills required to support families in their homes.

Once the course is complete, and references and checks (including an enhanced Disclosure & Barring Service check) have been taken up, a volunteer will visit a family for 2 to 3 hours a week.

Volunteers will complete a diary sheet record of each visit and meet up with a Coordinator every 6-8 weeks for supervision meetings. Our training is FREE to attend and travel expenses will be reimbursed for both training and home-visiting.
